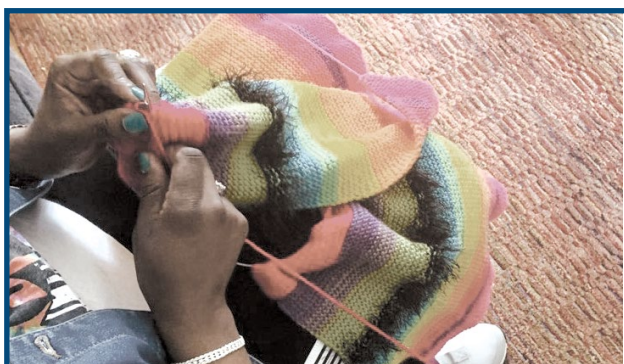

OUR MISSION

Dawn's Place proactively supports women affected by commercial sexual exploitation (CSE) and sex trafficking by providing services to women, raising awareness through education, and generating prevention, public policy reform and community collaborations. We are a 501(c)3 non-profit organization.



OUR RESIDENTS

During the program our residents work with staff to develop a plan for recovery, moving in phases designed to methodically and simultaneously increase responsibility for themselves, their future and the community and to build a sense of freedom and empowerment. This phase approach assists women in building a stable foundation on which to create a new life and provides a sense of accomplishment when they complete goals.

OUR STAFF

Our unique staff is comprised of professionals and graduate survivors.

The professionals bring years of combined experience in the complexities of care based on trauma from CSE. They have utilized survivor input to develop a program that incorporates current recommendation for best practices. We have an executive director, a clinical social worker/trauma specialist, and a day residential coordinator

Survivor graduates are key staff members who have given input to develop a comprehensive program which is designed for survivors of CSE. Our full-time, peer specialist is a survivor graduate and another is a week-end/evening supervisor.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING FACTS

- Within the United States, women, children and men are trafficked daily for commercial sex and forced labor.
- Victims may be rich, poor, foreign nationals, US citizens, adults, or children under 18 years.
- Traffickers may be individuals, small families, businesses, or criminal networks, or organized criminal syndicates.
- Thirty million people are held in modern-day slavery around the world.
- The average age of children entering prostitution is 11-14.
- Eighty percent of all transnational victims are women and girls.
- Homicide is the number one cause of death among prostituted women.
- 75-90% report they were sexually abused as children.
